The next generation of pet owners have lessons of their own

MIAMI (June 01, 2017) — On Wednesday, May 31, 2017, fifty-three Miami-Dade County Public Schools (MDCPS) students from elementary through high school, their teachers and parents gathered in the lobby of Miami-Dade County Animal Services' Pet Adoption and Protection Center (Animal Services) lobby for the 22nd HOPE (Help Overcome Pet Euthanasia) Contest Awards Ceremony.

The HOPE Contest Awards is a countywide initiative founded by School Board Member, Dr. Martin S. Karp approved by the MDCPS District Contest Committee for the Miami-Dade County Public Schools. Working in collaboration with Animal Services and the Humane Society of Greater Miami (HSGM), the contest teaches responsible pet ownership and care to the next generation of pet owners.

Students are required to develop innovative campaigns to help raise awareness about our roles as the stewards of domestic animals. This year, students were asked to develop messages about preventing and reporting animal cruelty. The judges, from Animal Services and the HSGM, had a difficult time selecting the winning entries because there were so many outstanding projects.

A total of 583 students participated in teams with over 103 project submissions and 53 winning students. The winning school teams, teachers and classes are:
